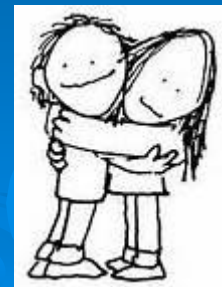
This focuses on the development and delivery of effective Talk in solo and in group situations

Effective Talk Looks Like

- Using appropriate eye contact
- Using gesture to express feelings or opinions
- Using posture to express feelings or opinions
- Recognising this body language in others



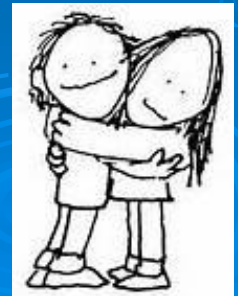
Effective Talk Sounds Like

- Talking to different audiences, up to and including the whole class
- Using tone of voice to underpin meaning and feelings
- Adjusting pace and vocabulary to suit your audience
- Ensuring clarity
- Being audible
- Staying on task



Effective Talk Feels Like

- Agreeing with other people or disagreeing with others in a respectful manner
- Asking relevant questions in the proper places
- Expressing a line of argument
- Responding appropriately to the views and ideas of others
- Participating with confidence in a Discussion, Talk or Presentation
- Expressing personal points of view in a Discussion, Talk or Presentation
