Agenda Item:	Discussion:
1. Use of ICT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Netbooks frequently do not work, are slow, broken, or are not charged. • Pupils can get confused because different teachers use different platforms to put homework on, e.g some use glow, some use yammer, and some use teams. Therefore, teachers should adopt a single standardised platform to reduce confusion. • Teachers should receive more ICT training, as there are many teachers who do not use glow etc, or are not fully sure on how to work it.
2. Litter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are no bins in the stairwell, which may be a reason why there is litter in the stairwell. • There are also no bins in the corridor, and pupils are often not allowed to use classroom bins, so pupils need to walk a considerable distance to find a bin.

4. Any Other Business	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Especially when the assembly hall is shut, there is not enough space, so other options should be explored - potentially using games hall, or teachers classrooms, or use the balcony in the social space. • The prices of food items at the canteen are not made clear, and many people are unsure. • The St. Mungo's app could be used to make clear the prices of school food items, also on the school website and twitter. • The rotational weeks are also not made clear, so pupils are unsure about which hot meals are being served for that day. • During registration, teachers should read out the lunch menu for that day, and perhaps the rest of the week. • Pupils are not happy about being asked to take off jackets whilst the outside temperature is so cold. • A 'St Mungo's jacket' could be introduced.
