Ideas and hints for parents who want to help their children improve their literacy skills. This focuses on listening skills.




What makes effective listening?

Feels like method







Effective Listening Looks Like

Supporting the speaker through showing an interest.

- This means -
- Making appropriate eye contact
- > Nodding
- ➤ Smiling
- Showing Concentration
- > Using appropriate body language



Effective Listening Sounds Like Being quiet and respectful so that:

I can follow the instructions of the speaker
I can reflect on the feelings a speaker conveys
When appropriate, I can use what I have heard to make notes or create a new text



Effective Listening Feels Like

Understanding how the speaker might be feeling. This makes listening feel: > Enjoyable > Engaging ➤ Challenging > Active and involved.
