Delivered in partnership with local secondary schools, Forth Valley College school-partnership courses will help St Mungo's students to learn more about the many different careers available to them and discover which one is right for them. They are offered at many different academic levels of study, so accommodate all students.

Courses available for S4 – S6 students will be delivered at many levels of study including National Certificate, Higher, Higher National Certificates (HNC), Foundation Apprenticeships (FA) and a wide range of vocational qualifications including City & Guilds as well as Skills for Work. Our S4 – S6 students can look forward to lots of hands-on learning and get their first taste of life post-school.

The courses summarised on the next few pages will be offered to S5 and S6 students who will be attending school next year and wish to mix and match their school timetable with vocational courses and or subjects which might not be delivered in school.

Assistance and support will be given to complete college application forms during Personal & Social Education (PSE) lessons; with further information given by Pastoral Heads. **Mrs Pollock is the main link to complete college application forms.**

Courses are scheduled to start **week beginning 12 June 2023** and staff from FV College will deliver a 2 week induction to all successful applicants until the end of June. **Students must attend these induction lessons.**

Transport

Transport will be provided from the school to college and from the college to your home area. Arrangements will be given once college places have been confirmed.

When to apply

- Courses are **now live** and you can view courses by using the hyperlinks above.
- You can only apply **online** via the college website
- All school college courses require you to complete an application form, designed to sell yourself and demonstrate relevant skills, experiences and how the course will support future aspirations.

Support will be given in school to complete your school-college application form during Mentoring or your PSE lessons. Please wait until these lessons have been completed before submitting your application form. We do advise everyone to get applications in as soon as possible.

Who should you speak to for support with your application form?

Mrs Pollock is the main school lead to support your application form. Please put your Pastoral Head as your referee (person who will write a report on your suitability for college).

What happens after you submit your application form?

College staff will acknowledge receipt of your application, look at your form and then:

- Check that you meet the entry requirements
- Ensure you are on track to meet requirements stated by them (if applicable)
- Contact school staff (Pastoral Staff) to ask for a reference and make sure the course is suitable for you
- Contact Support for Learning staff to ensure that all academic, medical and physical needs are met

College staff will always contact you by email, using the email address you use in your application form.

Higher National Certificate (HNC) Courses

Pupils entering Fifth Year in August 2023 and plan to stay on in S6 can sign up to study a Higher National Certificate (HNC) as one of their course choices. **Students must commit to study this course over two years across Fifth and Sixth Year, although** some HNC courses are offered as a 1-year study option.

HNC study is at the same level of study as an Advanced Higher (SCQF Level 7) and on completion, can lead directly to year two of a Higher National Diploma (HND) at Forth Valley College, or even directly into year two of some degree courses at university. The courses might run until 4:30pm on Tuesday and Thursdays.

HNCs are for pupils who are **aiming to/have achieved at least 2 Highers (in S5)** or by the end of S6. **Click on the course name (blue text) to be taken to the college website to get more details of courses**

Skills for Work Courses (SfW)

Students in Fifth or Sixth Year can sign up to study a ‘Skills for Work’ Course which will be studied over one year and will count as one subject choice. These courses are studied at a National 5 (Level 5) or Higher (Level 6) equivalency and will be offered at Falkirk, Stirling and Alloa campuses on a Tuesday and Thursday afternoon.

Skills for Work courses which run at Stirling will involve a full day’s study on a Friday and requires further discussion re. timetabling with Miss Marshall. Skills for Work courses offer a fantastic opportunity for pupils to embark on their chosen career path early, enhance their application for college– as they will have a competitive edge over other candidates or enter employment in their chosen field directly after learning school.

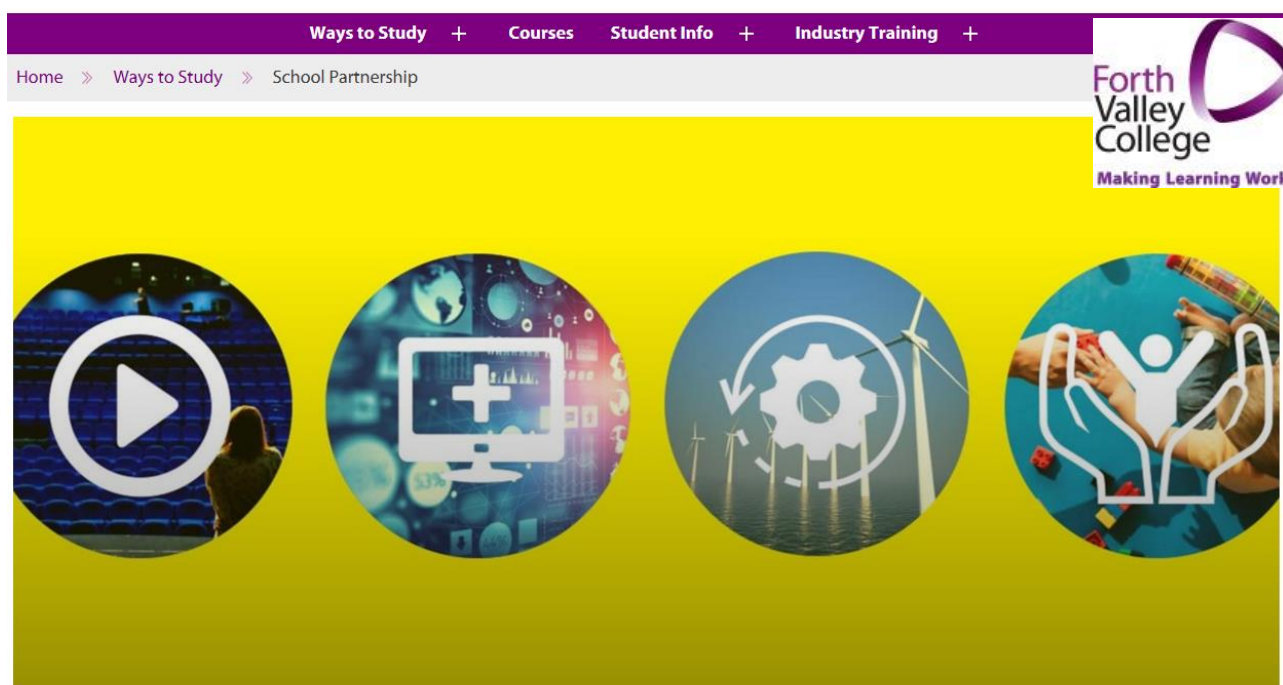

A Foundation Apprenticeship is the equivalent to a Higher – making it highly sought after by employers, colleges and universities.

Key information about school-college courses

Things you might want/need to know about attending College while still at secondary school:

How to apply –

All College courses require students to complete an online application form.

Students will be given support to complete the school college application form. **Please note, that Forth Valley College will not be able to accept any application form that has not been approved by the relevant Pastoral or Year Head.**

Behaviour while at college –

Respect is a two-way street - Forth Valley College expect all students to behave in a responsible, considerate way by respecting fellow students, staff and college property. In return, they will treat you with the respect you deserve...If not, you may be asked to return to school without completing your course.

Attendance –

The College will report your attendance back to your school, so it is important that you attend college and classes when you are expected to. Always remember to ask parents/carers to explain any absences either to school or college. Courses normally begin at the end of August.

Additional Support –

We will make sure that any additional support needed for attending college will be in place for you to start your course, please speak to your pastoral head about this when making your application.

Travel –

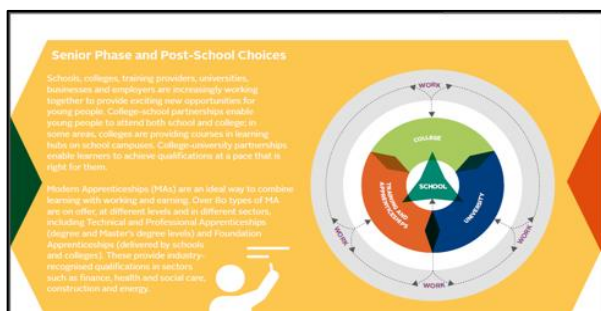
